July 2016- present

Undergraduate

- AGED 300 *Introduction to Agricultural Education*
This course is an introduction to the Ag Ed program. I taught students the foundation and history of agricultural education as well as led discussions in where it is going in the future. I helped create new assignments (Vision and Goals poster, SAE Teaching, and AET recordbook) to assess student learning. Dr. Ulmer taught the other section and we worked together to bring in guest speakers and plan a field trip for the class.
Taught- Fall 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019, 2020, 2021, 2022, 2023, 2024
- AGED 500 *Methods of Teaching Agriculture in the Secondary and Middle Schools*
This course focused on the principles of teaching applied to agricultural education instruction in the secondary and middle schools. I taught lessons to meet the felt needs of the preservice teachers. Lessons included: lesson planning, set induction, evaluation, rubric design, and other pedagogical items. **Taught-** Fall 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019, 2020, 2021, 2022, 2024
- AGED 520 *Block II Lab: Content Area Methods and Field Experience*
This course consists of a field-based experience to help the preservice teachers plan, teach, and evaluate their lessons. I worked with 7 high school agriculture teachers to host students in their classrooms. Students planned and taught 4 lessons in classrooms. We then reflected on each experience.
Taught- Fall 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019, 2020, 2021, 2022, 2024
- AGED 630 *Exploration of Global Agricultural Education*
This is a study abroad course. The focus was on the agriculture industry and agricultural education in an international location. I lead predeparture class sessions, had relevant assignments both before, during and after the experience, and worked to help students deepen their global understanding.
Taught- Summer 2024
- EDSEC 586 *Teaching Internship Secondary Schools – Agricultural Education*

This course comprises of the 16-week internship (student teaching). Students spend their time learning from a professional agriculture teacher in a high school classroom. I was the university supervisor for 5 specific teachers, visited 6 others, and worked with the Ag Ed faculty to meet the educational and emotional needs of the interns.

Taught- Spring 2017, 2018, 2019, 2020, 2021, 2022, 2023

GENAG 201 *Leadership for Agricultural Advocacy*

This course develops advocacy skills for the agriculture industry by examining assumptions and models of advocacy and leadership. Students will explore and engage with agricultural issues from the perspective of multiple stakeholders and develop skills in critical thinking, communication, and productive conflict.

Taught- Fall 2020, 2021

GENAG 201 *Cultivating Agricultural Literacy*

This course will cultivate your own agricultural literacy while enhancing your teaching, communication, and advocacy skills to advance the agriculture industry. We will explore agricultural issues from the perspective of multiple stakeholders through purposeful discussions and keynote speakers. This class will be highly interactive with opportunities to discuss agricultural topics and agricultural literacy programs. We will focus on current events, engage with industry leaders, and strategize how we can all become more agriculturally literate.

Taught- Fall 2022

GENAG 201 *Lights, Camera, Agriculture*

This course will build our understanding of the agriculture industry while critiquing how agriculture is depicted in visual entertainment. We will also develop your own agricultural literacy skills to advance the agriculture industry. This class will be highly interactive with opportunities to discuss agricultural topics using multimedia examples.

Taught- Fall 2023

GENAG 505 *Agricultural Industry in the Czech Republic*

This course consists of pre-departure meetings and an in-country experience in the Czech Republic. Preparatory class meetings during the spring semester acquaints students with CR agriculture, history, and culture. Additionally cultural aspects of and Kansas connections to the Czech Republic are explored. The experience includes trips to agriculture businesses and farms as well as visits to university and vocational agricultural schools and governmental agencies, The culture and history of the country is experienced throughout the trip.

Taught- Spring 2018

Graduate

- AGED 850 *Curriculum Development in Agricultural Education*
This course is taught online for K-State and AG*IDEA students. The students complete readings and discussions about curriculum theories, challenges, and opportunities that focus on teacher decision-making. The goal of the course is to develop rigorous, relevant and comprehensive curriculum focused on the local agricultural education program.
Taught- Spring 2018, 2019, 2020, 2021, 2022, 2023, 2024

PREVIOUS TEACHING EXPERIENCE

Mississippi State University, Starkville, MS August 2012- May 2016
School of Human Sciences, Agricultural Information Science

Undergraduate

- AIS 2413 *Introduction to Agricultural Information Science*
This course focuses on introducing students to careers associated with agricultural information science, agricultural education both formal and non-formal, and agricultural advocacy. I utilize guest speakers to communicate concepts in the curriculum and speak of career opportunities. I also work to make them aware of the support services located on campus.
Taught- Fall 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015
- AIS 3013 *Field-Based Experience in AIS*
I designed this course to meet the agricultural mechanic development needs of pre-service teachers. Also, the course will allow for focus on horticulture competencies in future semesters. I worked with current high school ag teachers to host students. The students were asked to complete 120 hours of observation and complete related assignments. I met with the students once a week to track their progress.
Taught- Fall 2014, Spring 2015, Summer 2015, Fall 2015
- AIS 3203 *Professional Writing in Agri., Natural Resources and Human Sciences*
This course focuses on teaching the basic techniques and principles in communicating information relevant to agriculture, natural resources, and life sciences. Students completed a variety of writing assignments and a grant proposal. I added two assignments to the course: thank you note and request for letter of recommendation.
Taught- Summer 2015

- AIS 3333 *Professional Presentations in Agriculture and Life Sciences*
 This course focuses on developing students' public speaking skills in group and one-on-one settings. Students are asked to complete 5 presentations, a mock trade show, a parliamentary procedure demonstration, and a mock job interview. Rubrics were adjusted to better communicate the expectations for the assignments.
Taught- Spring 2013, Fall 2013, Spring 2014
- AIS 3500 *Internship (Agricultural Science & AIS-Leadership)*
 Students complete at least 150 hours working with agricultural professionals in a variety of environments. I facilitated this course with the assistance of two graduate students.
Taught- Summer 2015
- AIS 3803 *Leadership Development in Agriculture and Life Sciences*
 This course is the foundational course for the leadership courses in our program. I taught students through engaging activities and lectures and evaluate students' teamwork skills through an innovative group activity.
Taught- Fall 2012, Spring 2013
- AIS 4403 *Development of Youth Programs*
 This course works to teach students the competencies needed to plan, design, advise, and evaluate youth programs. I worked to develop engaging lessons and assignments to gauge their academic growth.
Taught- Spring 2013, 2014, 2015, Summer 2015, Spring 2016
- AIS/HS 4424 *Teaching Methods in Agriculture and Human Sciences*
 This course is multidisciplinary with students from a wide variety of backgrounds and majors in the same lecture. I made adjustments to the course to better students for the microteaching labs. In addition to the lecture, I also facilitated the 6 lab sections and 5 lab teachers. Made adjustments to the microteaching assignments for lab.
Taught- Fall 2014, Spring 2015, Fall 2015, Spring 2016
- Teaching Methods Lab*
 This course is a component of the AIS 4424 course. The grades students receive in their lab portion roll into their overall grade. Each semester I worked to evaluate the students (8-9 total) in their ability to effectively conduct five lessons. I provided specific feedback to help students develop their teaching skills and facilitated discussion of their methods.
Taught- F'12, F'13, Spring 2014, F'14, Spring 2015, F'15, Spring 2016
- AIS 4873 *Professional Seminar in AIS (Student Teaching Seminar)*
 The first two times I just helped with this course, but then I took it over in the Spring 2014. I worked to develop material and presentations to meet

the needs of student teaching interns. I assisted students in reflecting on their experiences in the field. We met at least four times over the course of the semester. I also helped create assignments which are more closely tied to agricultural education. In the Spring 2014, I worked alongside the FCS teacher supervisor for cross-disciplinary lessons.

AIS 4896

Student Teaching in AIS

This course is the time students spend working with a current high school agriculture class. I made at least 4 trips to supervise the student throughout the semester and complete all the requirements mandated by the OCFBI office in the College of Education. I worked to provide constructive feedback and resources to help intern develop and evaluate weekly lesson plans and other required assignments.
